













Flipping the Model

typically began with a US-based researcher proposing a project and bringing in host country researchers. It's time to flip the model.

 ALL-IN supports local leadership innovation to meet development challenges in a way that is inclusive, effective and sustainable.

The ALL-IN Portfolio

- In creating our research portfolio, we invited proposals researchers and institutions that have the skills, talents and ideas for impactful research, even if lacking in experience implementing and managing large-scale research projects.
- ALL-IN funds 12 research projects, each with budgets up to half a million dollars, in Ghana, Nigeria, Kenya, Malawi, Uganda, and Ethiopia.
- ALL-IN research projects span all three of the MRR Innovation Lab's core themes:
 - Resilient Escapes from Poverty

Locally-Led Research for Development Impacts

Local researchers define research priorities based on deep knowledge of local issues and the history, systems and culture behind them.

The knowledge and connections of local researchers enable them to strategically approach policymakers, while their consistent in-country presence fosters long-term relationships and trust.





ALL-IN as part of the MRR's Research Consortium

All selected recipients of research funding under ALL-IN were onboarded as an independent cohort and then become part of the MRR Innovation Lab's virtual research consortium.

This structure provides the opportunity to further enhance capacity, create opportunities for future areas of inquiry and both broaden and deepen research networks for all participants - for both our Africabased and US-based researchers.
